
#### **EXPECTED RESULTS**

The main project results include:

- 1. A Refugees Welcome Map identifying the integration activities carried out investigating regulatory measures undertaken directly by universities.
- 2. An e-learning package providing University students with the skills to develop their potential civic role in promoting integration of refugees
- 3. A set of Guidelines addressed to Higher education staff resulting in the improvement of their capacity of planning and implementing strategies for the integration of refugees











- A Map identifying the integration activities carried out investigating regulatory measures of integration undertaken directly by universities in Europe.
- More than 200 initiatives have been collected and uploaded to the Refugees Welcome Map by more than 100 Institutions from 25 countries across Europe: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Republic of Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, UK.

- Refugees participated in the program, regardless of their age, using their computers / laptops / mobiles / tablets in order to participate.
- Refugees were asked to choose between twelve languages and declared their choice. By this way, they were trained and practiced by taking relevant tests. The available languages were Greek, English, French, German, Dutch, Italian, Spanish, Polish, Czech, Danish, Portuguese, and Swedish.
- The courses were held at the amphitheaters of the university, as well as at the refugee camps, with the help of 39 volunteers "operators", who were in the refugee camps and helped those who needed extra support regarding the use of the platform.

- he main purpose of the research was to establish an approach to the language development and learning process in the framework of translanguaging, through refugee identity texts, in a continuous dialectic relationship with the researchers and with the objective of inclusion practices. The research objectives were:
- The democratization of researchers' discourse through continuous reflection and amendment of practices
- The determination of educational material characteristics suitable for meeting language teaching needs of adult refugees
- The contribution to inclusion of refugees in Greek society, on terms of fair and equal coexistence.
