Description of the organisation

REDU has been active informally since 2001 promoting a culture of human rights through local and national training courses, seminars, creation of educational and pedagogical materials and tools.

REDU board members were very active in coordinating the participative translation procedure of Compass manual of the Council of Europe from English to Italian (1st version), its promotion and dissemination in Italy.

Staff members were also involved in the testing phase of Compasito manual, offering an important contribution for its revision and edition to the Youth department of the Council of Europe.

Since 2007, REDU is a national network officially registered. The legal seat has been moved recently from Latina to Florence, because most of the staff members and volunteers are living and working in that area.

REDU mission is to foster a culture of peace and solidarity promoting human rights education activities. REDU activities are mainly related to HR and HR education, democratic citizenship, antidiscrimination. In more than 10 years, REDU has implemented educational activities for teachers, trainers, youth workers and young people. REDU has also translated Compass (I and II version) and Compasito into Italian, disseminating CoE tools at national level.

In the last 5 years, REDU has developed expertise in the evaluation field, running external evaluations of Erasmus+ KA2 and KA3 projects and FAMI initiatives.

- In 2017 promoted CO2 project to foster collaborative systems at local and national level and started to work on TEVIP project about European values and their translation in practice and on the STAR project against invisible racism.

- Since 2018, REDU is a regional coordination point of the EU Campaign on NO HATE SPEECH.
- In 2019, implemented the "Quadratura del cerchio" project, with the support of Florence Municipality
